

## ACCESSIBILITY

### *Atlanta to the Atlantic* installations and events

These installations are in City of Atlanta parks which have varying terrain, some slopes, and surfaces that include tree roots, gravel, and mulch. Our recommended routes to the installations and events are as follows:

#### **Perkerson Park**

The installations and opening event on Sat, Sept. 21 can be accessed:

- From the [parking lot](#), rather than take the ramp across the bridge to the pavilions, follow the worn path behind the restrooms along the other side of the creek. After a short incline at the beginning, the area is flat, with short grass and dirt but without roots.
- At the project site, there is another short incline, this time dirt and with some roots, but they do not cover the entire area.

Our gatherings will be at this site, which seems to be the favorite spot for park-goers to enjoy the creek.

The alternate path from the parking lot takes you alongside the pavilions to the top of the project and has a beautiful view looking downstream. There is a bridge with steps over the creek from this location to the one referenced above.

#### **Arthur Langford, Jr. Park**

The installations at Arthur Langford, Jr. Park are accessible from the parking area behind the Community Center. A ramp from the parking lot accesses the sidewalk, which continues over the bridge and into the park. The surface of this path is the rubber surfaces common on playgrounds.

#### **Kirkwood Urban Forest**

Kirkwood Urban Forest is an outdoor forest environment. Surfaces are rough and varied, including gravel and mulch, and some very narrow pathways. From a rather flat site along Dearborn Street at Bixby Street, a sloping path leads through the woods to the creek.

A key component of the installation is street level on Dearborn Street. The curb dips—and the best place to access—is [here](#). The ground is covered in mulch, but we are trying to maintain a path raked of larger debris from this curb to the installation site.
